Greetings from Mozambique!

What a joy it is to hear from you and more importantly, for you and your church acts of faith, love and solidarity with the Church in Mozambique.

- Yes, there are numbers of churches in North, Southern and South Conferences already identified approximately 65% of our churches are located in the rural setting, where electricity is not available.
- So far we have sampled 50 houses for phase 1, out of a total of approximately 200 houses.
- We have already launched the installation in the first parsonage (Barrane UMC) in Morrumbene District and the idea is to continue with the exercise as more funds come in.
- Here are the fruits as a result of the installation of solar panels in the parsonage:
 - Pastor has a lot more time to plan church activities, including preaching;
 - Pastor's family with enjoy the light and has more time to interact and children work on school home-work
 - Pastor's family has exposure to national and international news through radio and TV
 - Pastor's family can have their clothes ironed properly
 - Pastoral family and surroundings protected from snakes, scorpions, awls and other dangerous creatures
 - Congregation members charge cellphones and pay \$0,079 (5MZN), for the maintenance fund
 - Congregation meets for revivals, church board meetings and charge celebrations held till late, and hence have more exposure to church life.
 - Congregation hold Bible studies and has initiated an adult education class meeting in the evening (about 10 members now are able to read the Bible and write)
 - People use normal daylight for normal family activities, including farming, and later in the evening they meet at the church
 - 3 more families have been added to the congregation (Outreach), as they realized the intensity of church activities during the evenings
 - This is what I can share as the merits of this project. We will be covering more ground as more funds are raised for the purpose.
